

## HOW TO INSTALL YOUR WALL PANELLING KIT AND DADO RAIL

## What You Will Need

- Pencil
- Measuring tape
- Adhesive
- Spirit level
- Filler
- Caulk
- Sandpaper
- Wood primer
- Paint


You will have a collection of MDF strips for your wall panelling in up to three different lengths. Each will be labelled WP-A, WP-B and WP-C as shown in the example label. You will also have your Dado Rail which will be labelled WP-Dado-A.





These will all be arranged on your wall like in the illustration below.

- A Horizontal wood strips B - Vertical wood strips
- C Divider wood strips Dado rail



\* The layout above is for illustration purposes only, therefore:

• You may have more or fewer rows/columns than the illustration.

• If you have not opted for multiple rows of your wall panelling you will not have any C panels.

• If your wall width is larger than 1500mm, you will receive your top A strips in multiple pieces to make up the total length required. These will be equal sizes so can be joined in the middle.

## **STEP BY STEP GUIDE**

<b>Step 1</b> : Prepare your space by ensuring the wall is smooth. Lie out your Dado Rail and your MDF strips on the floor and group the strips by size (A, B and C).	<b>Step 2</b> : Mark your MDF strip positions on the wall with a pencil, You can use the measurements provided in the 'Technical View' of our online visualiser. If you have C strips, they can serve as a ruler for accurate spacing.	<b>Step 3</b> : Apply a snaking line of adhesive to the A strip(s) for the base. Using a spirit level, adhere horizontally along the bottom of the wall.
<b>Step 4</b> : Next, adhere the B strips to the wall vertically using the spirit level. If you have C strips, add these to the wall afterwards. You can then apply your top A strip(s).	<b>Step 5</b> : Apply your Dado Rail to the wall above your top A strip(s) with adhesive.	<b>Step 6</b> : If you have opted to add beading to your panelling, please now look at the Beading instructions page before coming back to this page for step 7.
<b>Step 7</b> : Once dry, use wall filler to fill any gaps between the strips. If you've measured well, the gaps should be small.	<b>Step 8</b> : Caulk around all edges of the MDF wall panels making sure to smooth evenly with a clean slightly wet finger or application tool. Once this is done, wait until dry.	<b>Step 9</b> : Prep the panelling for painting by sanding the joins which you've filled with filler. This helps the paint adhere and makes the join seamless and flat.
<b>Step 10</b> : Apply the wood primer evenly and wait to dry. You can skip this step if you chose for us to apply the priming for you.	<b>Step 11</b> : Paint the panels and wall with your chosen colour.	<b>Step 12</b> : Finally, you're free to tidy up and furnish your newly decorated room!
